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



Berlin is *the* place for contemporary art. Some 10,000 artists live here and there are over 600 galleries – more than in New York City. Many collectors have moved here and the entire art world gets together for events like the Berlin Biennale. It's an inspiring, constantly evolving city; and it's still cheap: artists can afford to have an apartment *and* a studio.

• GALLERY QUARTER SCHEUNENVIERTEL

Mitte's Auguststrasse and Linienstrasse were the birthplaces of Berlin's post-Wall contemporary art scene. Some have since moved on to bigger digs, but key players Eigen+Art (www.eigenart.de; Auguststrasse 26) and Neugerriemschneider (www.neuger riemschneider.com; Linienstrasse 155) are still there, alongside exciting new galleries like Kunstagenten (www.kunstagenten.de; Linienstrasse 155) and the innovative DNA Galerie (www.dna-galerie.de; Auguststrasse 20).

O GALLERY QUARTER SCHÖNEBERG

Over the past three years, the slightly seedy area around Potsdamer Strasse and Kurfürstenstrasse has emerged as one of Berlin's most exciting art quarters. It's a great mix of established galleries like **Giti Nourbahksch** (www.nourbakhsch.de; Kurfürstenstrasse 12), which focuses on installations, and newcomers like **Sommer + Kohl** (www.sommerkohl.com; Kurfürstenstrasse 13/14), which specialises in sculpture.

6 GALLERY QUARTER CHECKPOINT CHARLIE

There's long been a cluster of important galleries on Zimmerstrasse and Rudi-Dutschke-Strasse in Kreuzberg, but of late a new corner has opened up on Markgrafenstrasse and Charlottenstrasse. Keep an eye out for Carlier Gebauer (www.car liergebauer.com; Markgrafenstrasse 67), Barbara Weiss Gallerie (www.galeriebarbaraweiss.de; Zimmerstrasse 88) and Antje Wachs Gallerie (www.antjewachs.de; Charlottenstrasse 3).

O STREET ART

Berlin has some of the best street art anywhere. There's fantastic work in Kreuzberg, especially the largescale works by Italian artist Blu at Falckenstrasse 48 and at the corner of Cuvrystrasse and Schlesische Strasse.

Boxhagener Platz in Friedrichshain is another hot spot, as is Brauerei Friedrichshöhe at Landsberger Allee 54, also in Friedrichshain. ATM Gallerie (www.atmberlin.de; Brunnenstrasse 24, Mitte) also focuses on street art.

9 SAMMLUNG BOROS

This is a great collection (www.sammlung -boros.de; Reinhardstrasse 20, Mitte) in a spectacular location – an old WWII bunker! What makes it special is how the space has been adapted for art and also how the artists have reacted to the space. There's one artist who's created a series of works that correspond with one another across several floors, opening up constantly changing perspectives.
